Year 3 Trip

On Tuesday 20th February all of Year 3 visited Everdon Stubbs (an ancient woodland near Daventry) as part of our Adventurers and Explorers project. We split into our three class groups to learn games about tracking animals and survival in the wild. In one game half the group had to wear blindfolds and use their other senses, such as hearing, to track where the other half of the class were. Once detected, they were squirted with water pistols! The rangers taught us all about how to light a campfire using a Fire Steel. It was really tricky to do this, but when we persevered we were so excited to ignite the cotton wool and watch it burn! A highlight of the visit was forming groups to build shelters and some of us were able to 'walk the plank,' which was a fallen tree in Everdon Wood. We could see so much from high up. We had an amazing day in the fresh air and learnt lots about being explorers.
